Presenter

Tonya Folks is the Human Trafficking Expert and Liaison for the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office. Assigned to the Regional Agencies Narcotics & Gun Enforcement (RANGE) Task Force, she works alongside the Human Trafficking Detective in various capacities including: victim advocate, research, presentations, community relations and investigations.

Ms. Folks founded a national anti-sex trafficking nonprofit in 2013, authored the Community Outreach for Runaway Youth (CORY) Project, and currently owns and operates Human Trafficking Essentials, LLC, a corporation which educates and innovates field tested programs in the area of human trafficking prevention and outreach across the nation. Tonya has trained over 50,000 people across the country on the topic of human trafficking and been part of over 60 rescues.

Description

The first two hours of the day will cover Labor Trafficking, how to identify it, the organizational structure and the types of labor trafficking we see in Ohio, including Asian Massage. This will include multiple cases.

The second session will focus on sex trafficking, definitions, organizational structure, subculture language and rules, red flag behaviors with individuals on probation, how to partner with law enforcement, cases, court observations, etc.

Human Trafficking Objectives

Recognize Human Trafficking

- Human Trafficking Defined
- Labor Trafficking operations, feeder countries and common exploitation avenues
- Sex Trafficking business model and organizational structure

This section of the presentation outlines in great depth the human trafficking issue in the United States, Ohio and Miami Valley today. Familiarity with the terms, the subculture and the business models equip attendees to recognize trafficking activity without the presence of a victim.

Red Flag Identification

- Unique Court/Probation Red Flag Familiarity
- General Red Flags

Law Enforcement and probation personnel are in a unique position to identify and respond to human trafficking. Traffickers often are arrested or appear in court for conduct or crimes related to their trafficking. Probation officers specifically can be a great aid in assisting law enforcement in identification and monitoring of perpetrators which has led to victim identification.

Community Resources & Reporting

- Step-by-step process of recognizing and responding

Once law enforcement and court professionals are able to identify victims in the populations they serve, they MUST know how to respond. This section of the presentation gives best practice advice on conducting interviews. It also walks the attendee through the step-by-step process of contacting the appropriate hotline and service providers.
